Key Drawing Word: Intermediate Shadow

SHADOW: In Holland we call this "plastycteyites," which translates to the drawn form of darkness opposite the light source, both on the object and the area near the object. Adding shadows next to and under the object will give your drawing the third dimension.

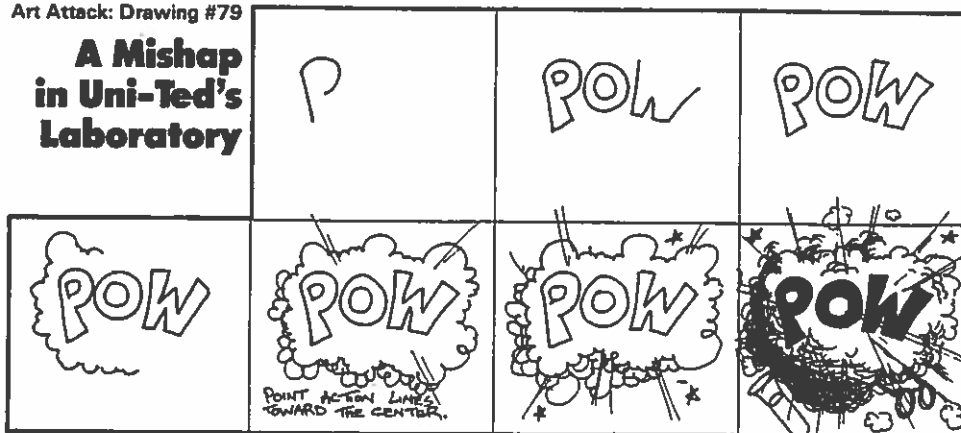

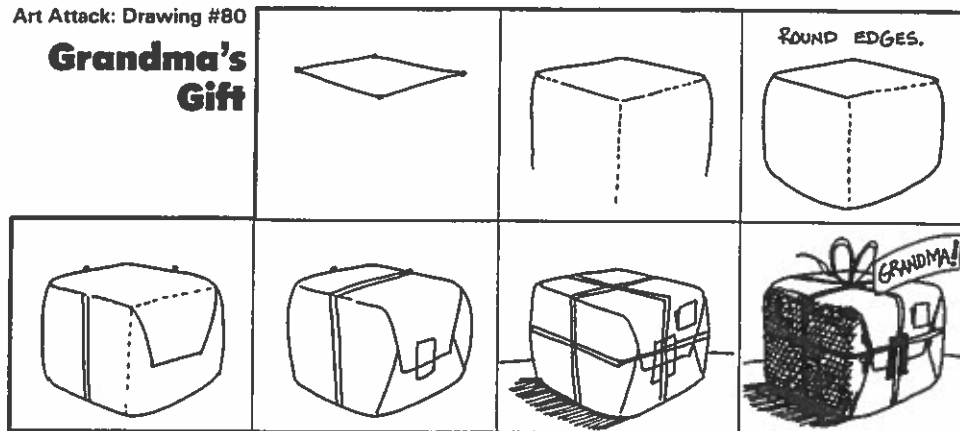

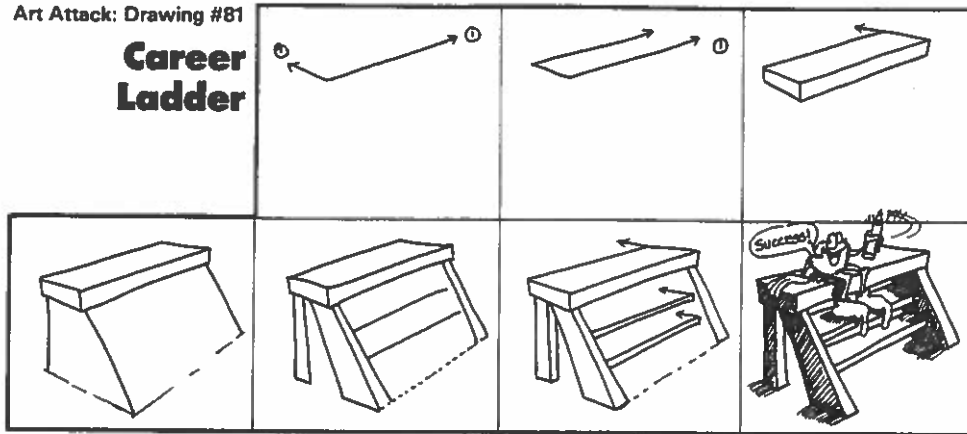

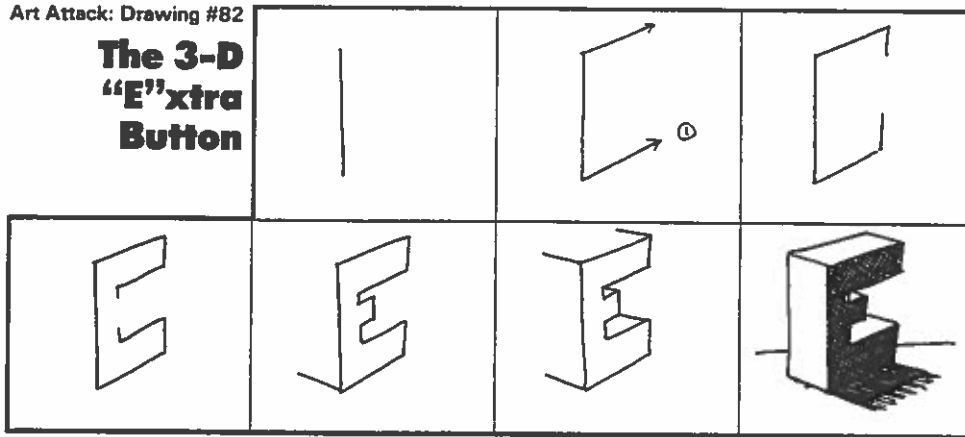

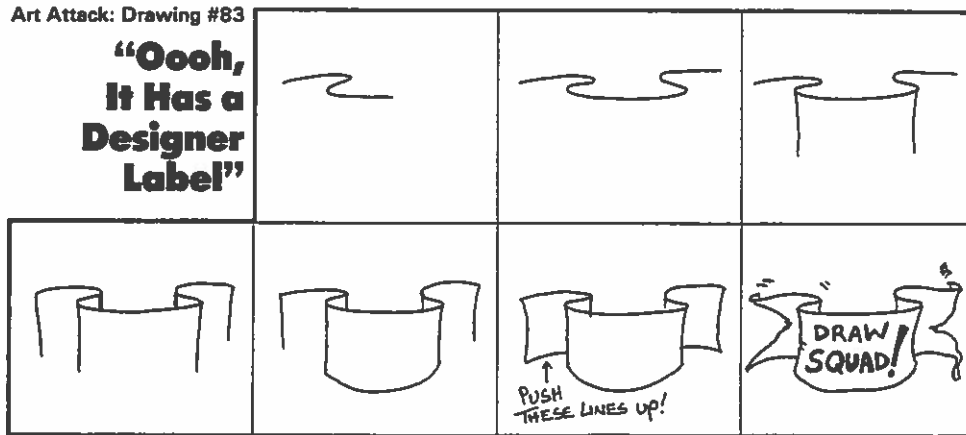
