## Warm-Up

Another row...blast!

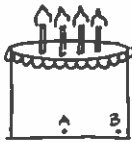


Fun, eh? One more row...



## Key Drawing Word: Surface

Each Key Drawing Word increases your ability to control objects on the flat **surface** of a piece of paper. Each word is a drawing tool to create depth—in other words, the third dimension. When you draw part of an object **lower** on the **surface** of your paper, you make it appear closer to you. For example, you curved the bottom of the cake instead of drawing it as a straight line. You also pulled the nearest corner of the package **lower** on the **surface** of your paper.

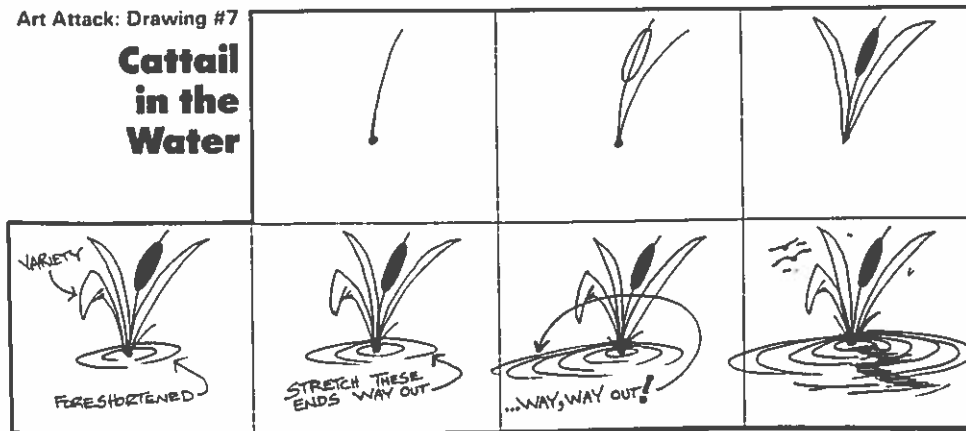


When Point A is lower than Point B, the cake appears three dimensional.



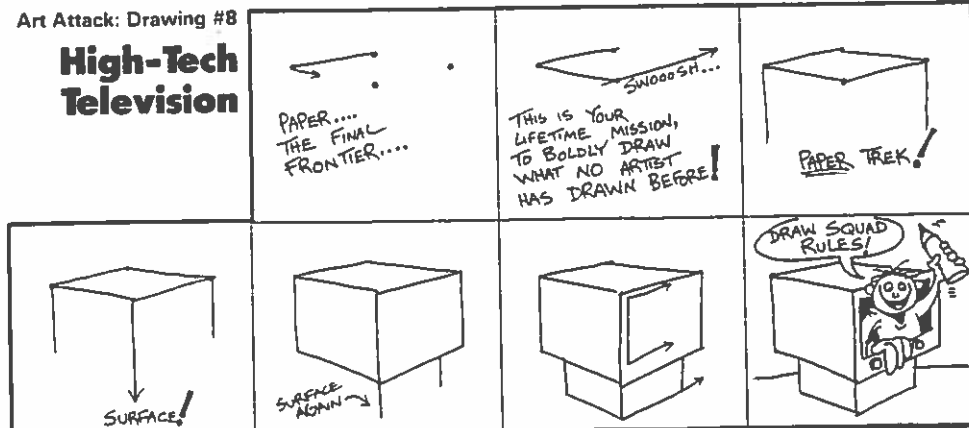

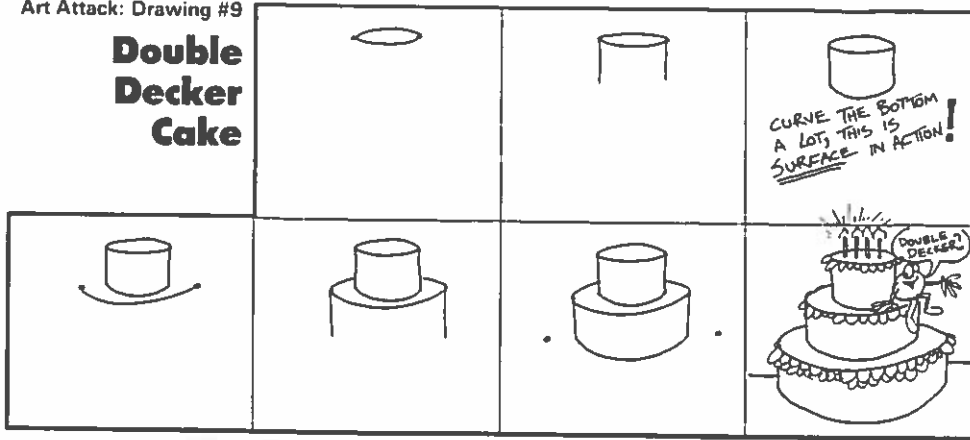

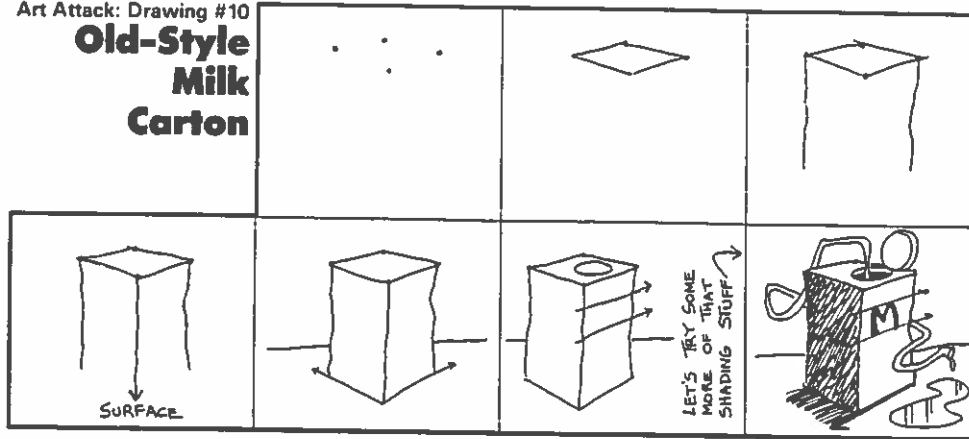

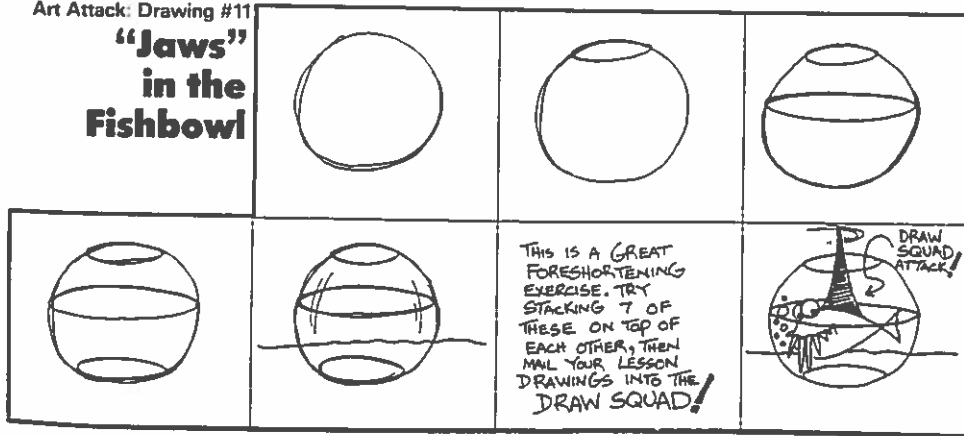
