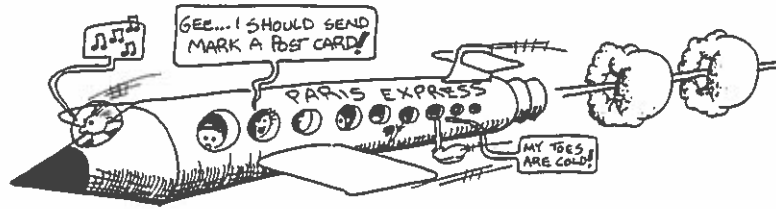

Key Drawing Word: Intermediate Daily

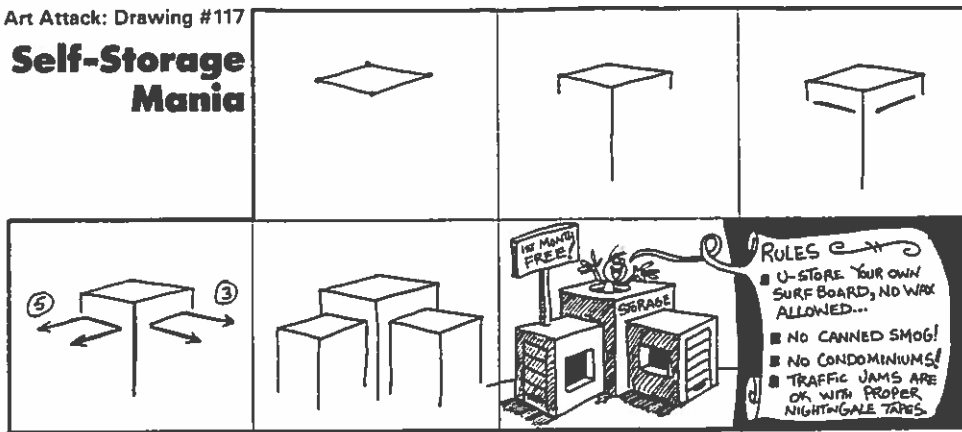

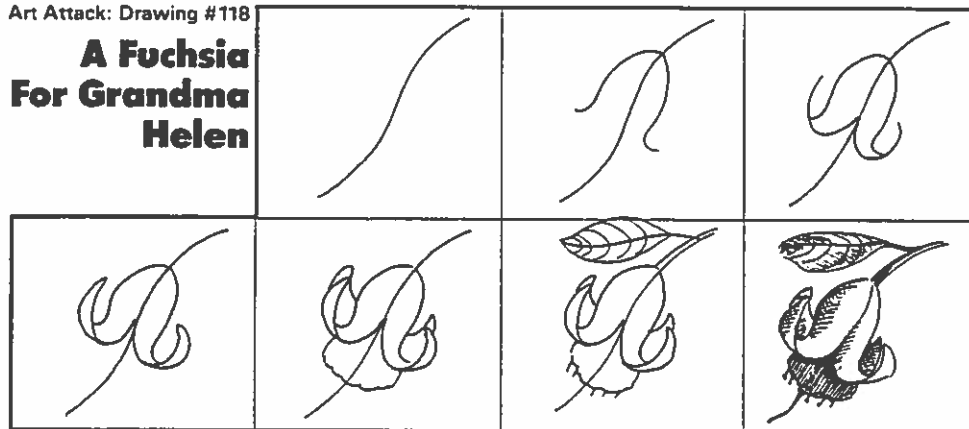

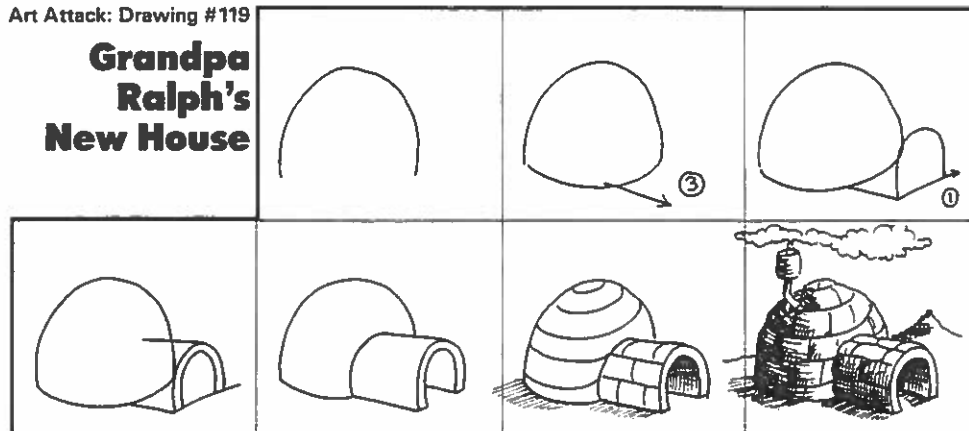
