

## Key Drawing Word: Advanced Shading

**SHADING:** The filling in of shadows (those dark areas away from light sources.) There are several different ways of representing shadows: by drawing lines around the edge of an object away from the light source, by increasing the concentration of lines, either parallel or perpendicular (as in crosshatching), or by increasing the density of dots as they recede from the light source (stippling).
