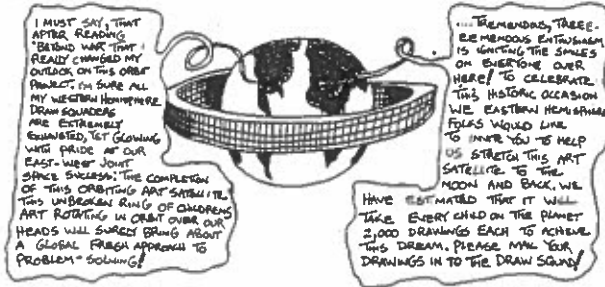


# LESSON 30

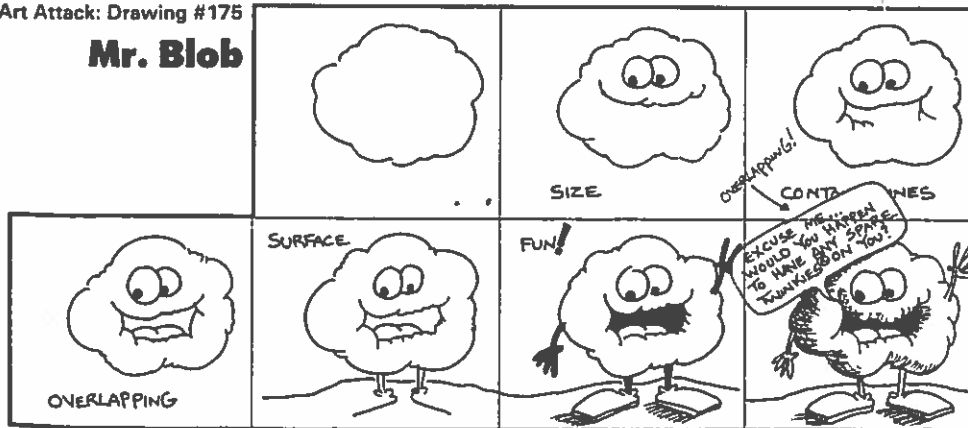

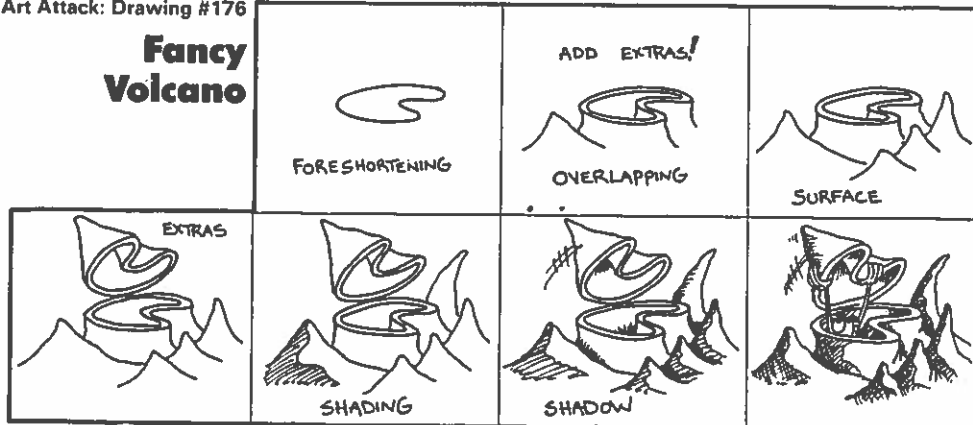

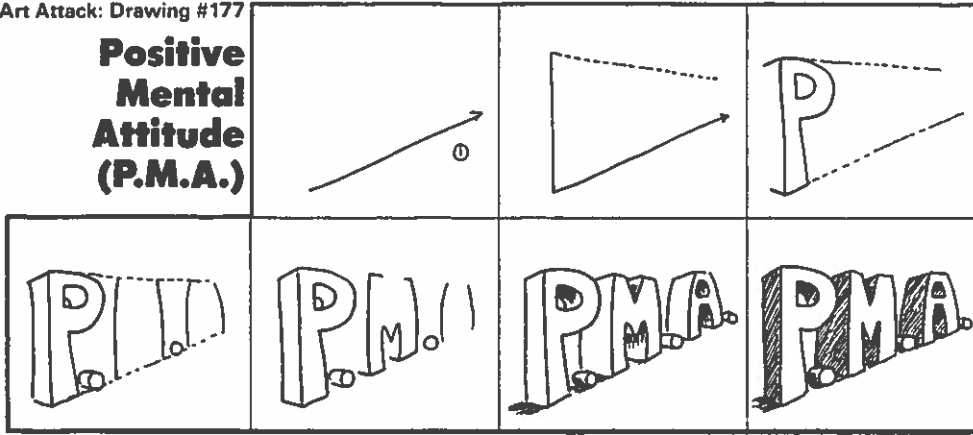

#### Fancy Volcano



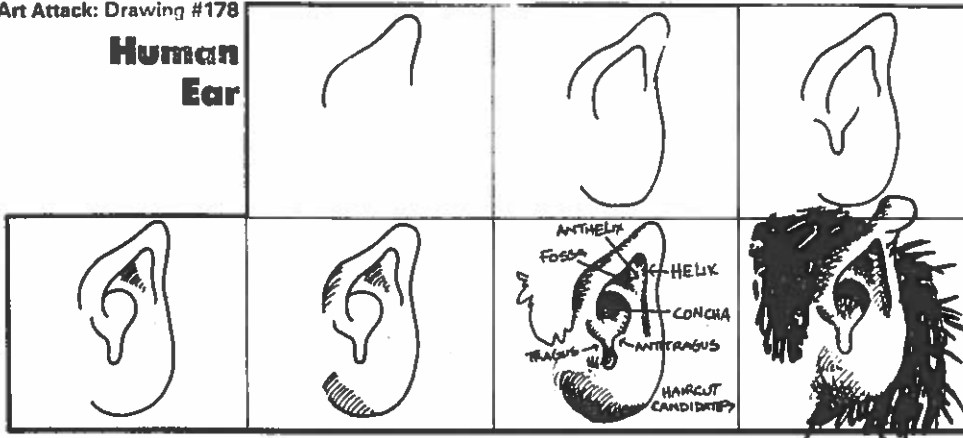

# Positive Mental Attitude (P.M.A.)



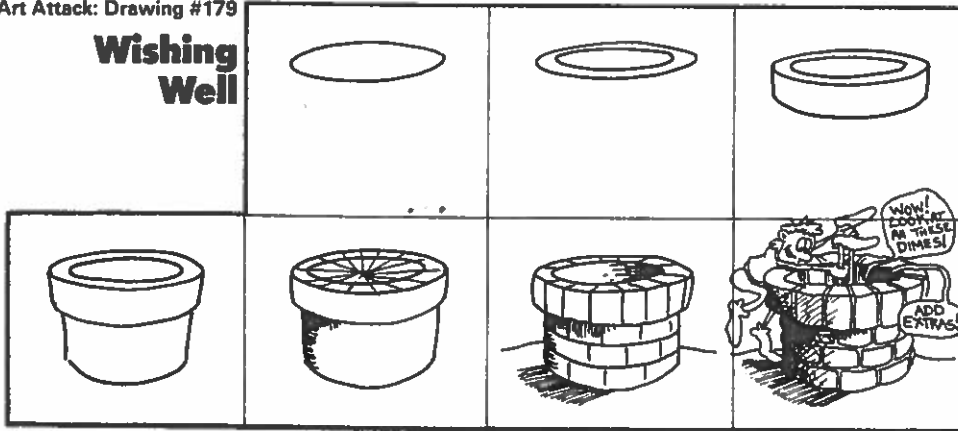
